Education at Tokushimakita High School is enjoyable through a s table environment, efficient organizational structures, caring teachers, a curriculum which caters to all ability groups in a setting where discipline is firm but fair, and characterized by mutual respect and understanding.

In 2003, Tokushimakita High School was designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as a Super English Language High School. Since then, Tokushimakita High School has been putting emphasis on English language education and international communication. We have sister school relationships with a total of three senior high schools in Germany, New Zealand and Thailand.

5 Educational Goals of Tokushimakita High School


- (1) To foster individuals who can pursue truth and act independently and self-reliantly.

1 General Course

2 International English Course






